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How to Use This Book

The acorn symbol indicates easier questions and activities, and the tree symbol indicates harder ones. And if all you use is the scripture references as a jumping off point to read out of your own Bible and have you own reflection or discussion, that is great too. Printable Resources

We have also created a variety of printable resources to go along with this short book. You can use these to complete some of the activities if you like.

- There is a Thankful Tree printable that you can fill in blessings on as many leaves as you want and display it in your home.
- There are also individual leaves that go along with each day's theme and blank ones for you to write on yourself. Write things you are thankful for on them, and remind yourself of your blessed life. Afterwards, you could hang them on a paper tree or on real tree branches in a vase.
- We have also included a variety of decorative printables to inspire a thankful spirit. You could print these out and display them around your house if you wish.
- You can also use the half and quarter page printables as greetings cards to thank people for blessing you or for just being themselves. Or you could use these cards for upcoming holidays.
